LifeNet International transforms African healthcare facilities to provide quality, sustainable healthcare and **save lives.**

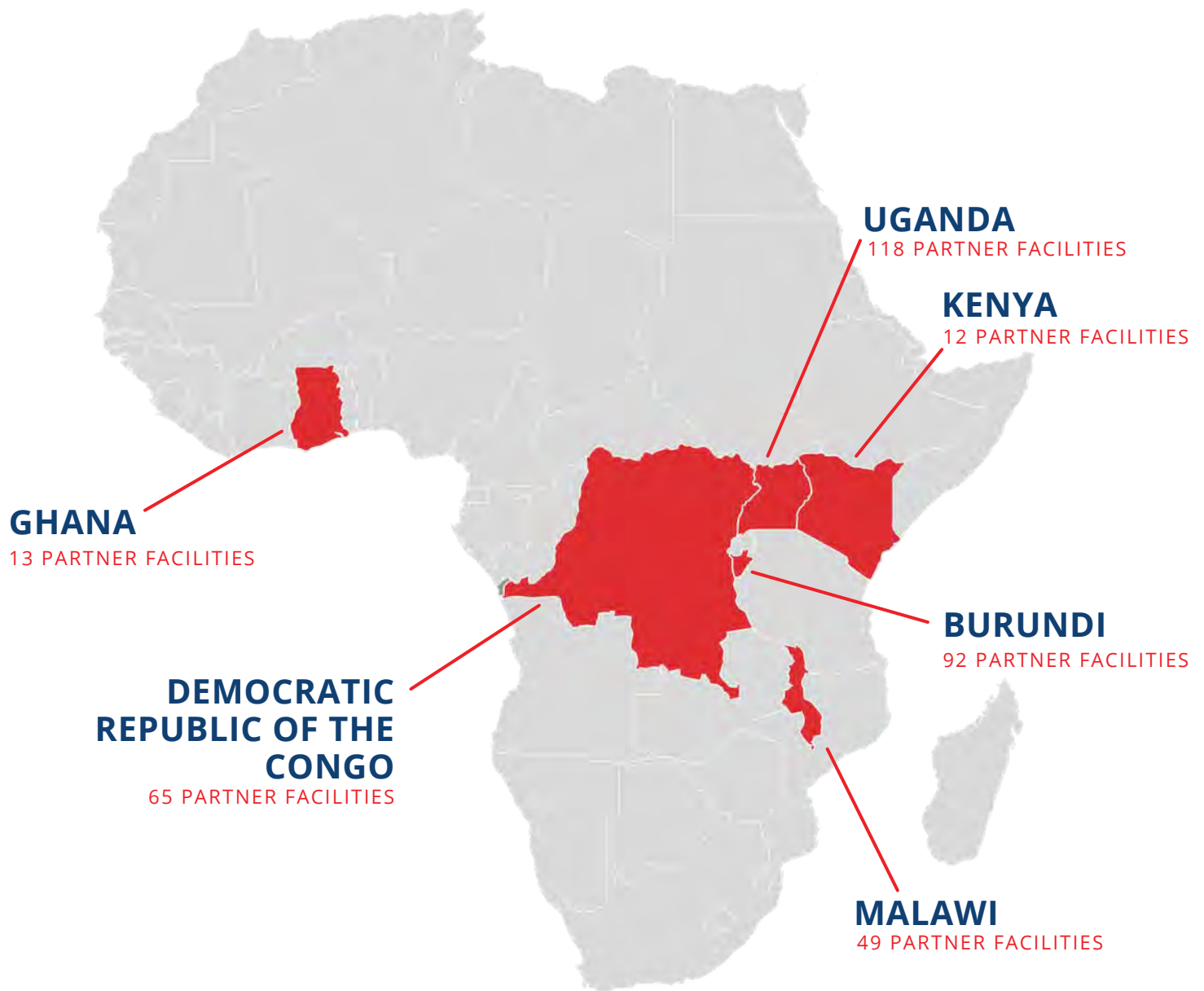

The LifeNet mission fuels our passion to address the **preventable** deaths and diseases plaguing communities in sub-Saharan Africa.



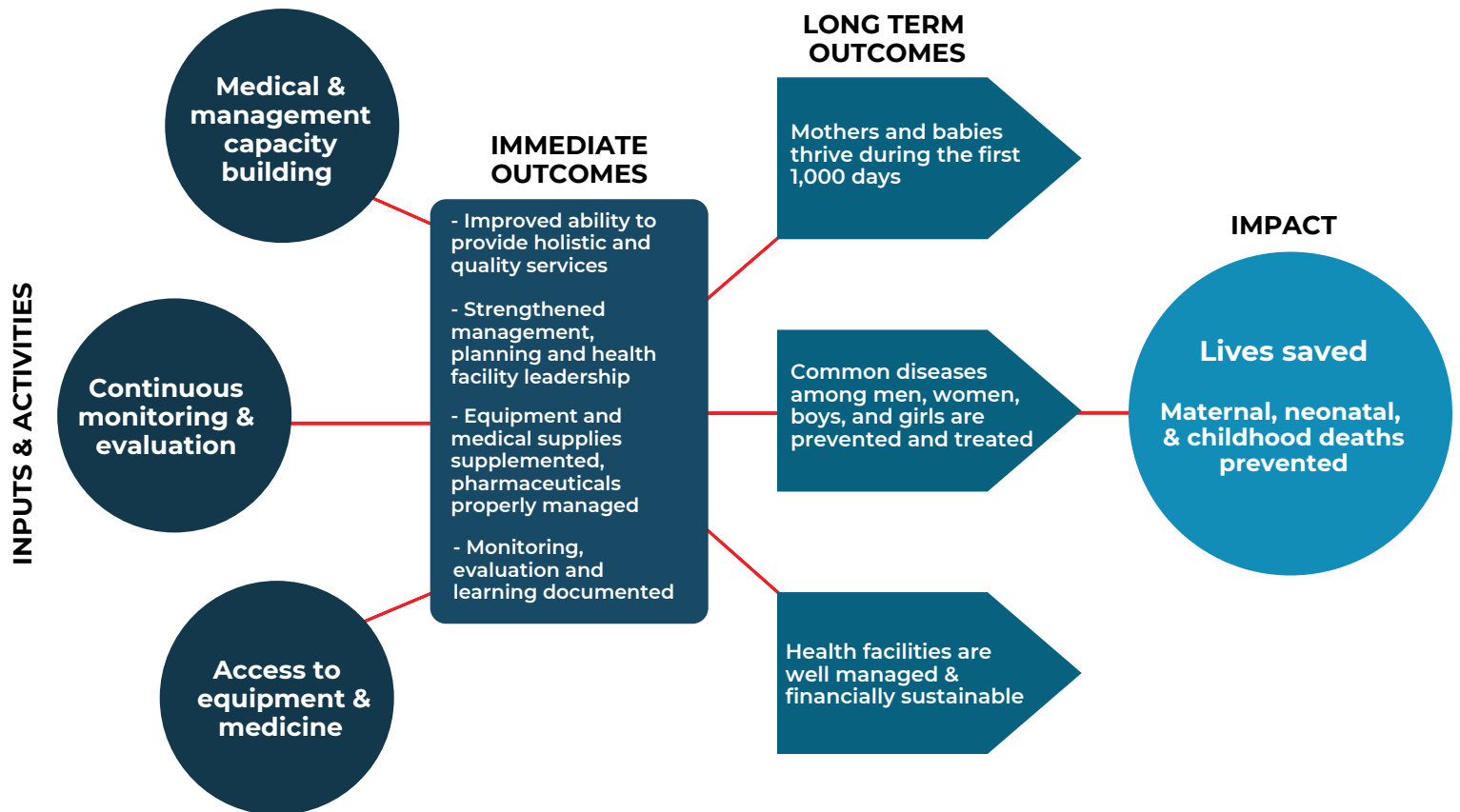

OUR APPROACH PREVENTS DISEASE & DEATH



MEDICAL TRAINING

Five modules of high-impact clinical care training addressing leading causes of preventable death using a hands-on, behavior change approach.



MANAGEMENT TRAINING

Four modules of management training that build financial resilience, efficient administration, and improved governance to help create more sustainable facilities.



EQUIPMENT SUPPLY

Access to the tools facilities need to save lives.



DIGITAL LEARNING

Accessible online training & support designed for low-resourced settings.



MONITORING, EVALUATION, AND LEARNING (MEL)

Real-time information to improve and grow.

KELLEN & ESTHER

Kellen Mashanyu is a mother in Uganda who found herself facing every mother's greatest fear: Her baby daughter, Esther, came down with malaria—a disease that takes the lives of hundreds of thousands of children each year. In fact, every 2 minutes, a child under the age of 5 dies of malaria. You can imagine the anxiety and urgency that Kellen felt as she carried Esther (pictured above) to find healthcare. Kellen took Esther to a LifeNet partner facility to get vital malaria treatment, and Esther has recovered well! The deaths of children like Esther from common diseases like malaria **are preventable.**

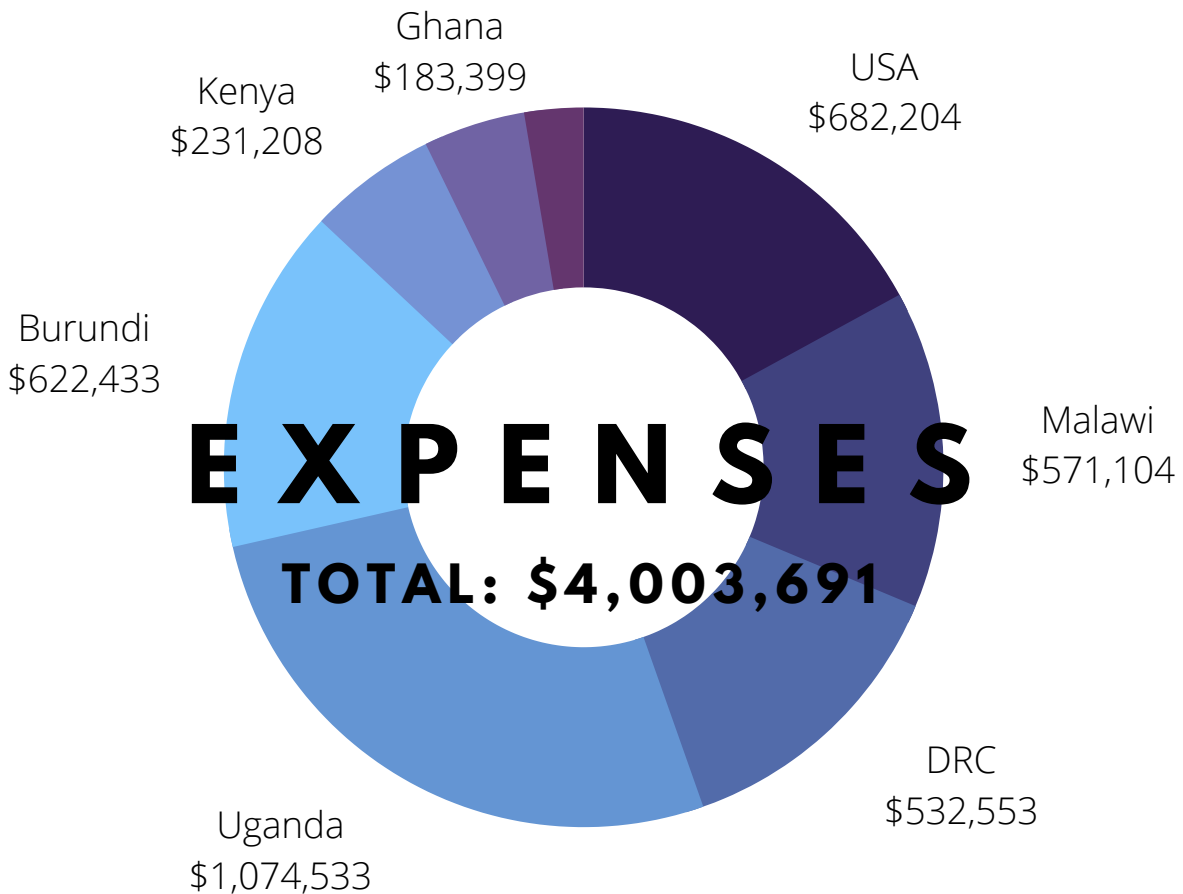
